



Angelina Ballerina's Positively Perfect Tiara

Every aspiring prima ballerina needs a glittery tiara to be the star of the show. Angelina's simple, paper tiara will make any girl feel like a fairy princess from the Royal Ballet!

The following activities are designed for parents and children to do together. Supervision of your children with materials such as glue, scissors, small jewels, etc is strongly recommended.

Time: 30 minutes

To create a Tiara you will need:

- Scissors – or pinking sheers for an extra fancy tiara
- Stapler
- Tape measure
- Construction paper (11" x 14") in red, pink and purple
- Pencil with eraser
- Glue Stick
- Assorted self-adhesive jewels, ribbon, stickers, etc.
- Assorted magic markers

Steps to Success:

1. Measure your child's head circumference at the forehead, where the tiara will sit.
2. Cut the red construction paper into a 2" strip. Make sure the strip is 1 ½" longer than your child's head circumference!
3. Using assorted colors of construction paper, draw a series of triangles of assorted sizes (1 large, 2 medium, 2 small) and cut them out. Pick your favorite color for the biggest, center shape.
4. Lay the paper strip flat and glue the triangles to the paper strip with the largest in the center, flanked by the triangles of decreasing size (line the triangles up with the bottom of the pink strip to offer the most support for the tiara).
5. Once all the triangles are glued, start decorating with the adhesive jewels and magic markers.
6. Hold the tiara around your child's head to re-check the size. Remove it and staple the red strip into a circle and place on your child's head!
7. Wear the tiara with pride and, as Angelina would say, "follow your dreams!"
